An explanation about your child's latest data report

As we approach the end of term, pupils in Years 7, 8 and 9 will receive their latest data report. Parents and pupils can expect to be able to see this information on Wednesday 15th December via the VLE. If you require a paper copy then please contact school and we will provide one for you.

What information will I receive about my child?

The report begins by showing your child's attendance and punctuality for this term, together with the number of positive credits (achievements) and negative debits (behaviour) they have had since September.

Then, for each subject, your child will receive two grades, as follows:

When issuing these grades, teachers have used their knowledge of your child's capabilities to decide how well he/she is learning the curriculum.

Attitude to Learning

This five point scale lets you know how well your child is approaching their studies, in terms of their attitude. Clearly there is a link between your child's attitude and the progress they can make in the future.

Parents of pupils in Y8 & 9 will realise that this reporting system marks a change for us at STM. The new assessment policy that is in place across all 25 schools in the St Ralph Sherwin Trust places less of an emphasis on grades/levels and more on what is being studied, remembered and learned.
