How ready are you to perform?

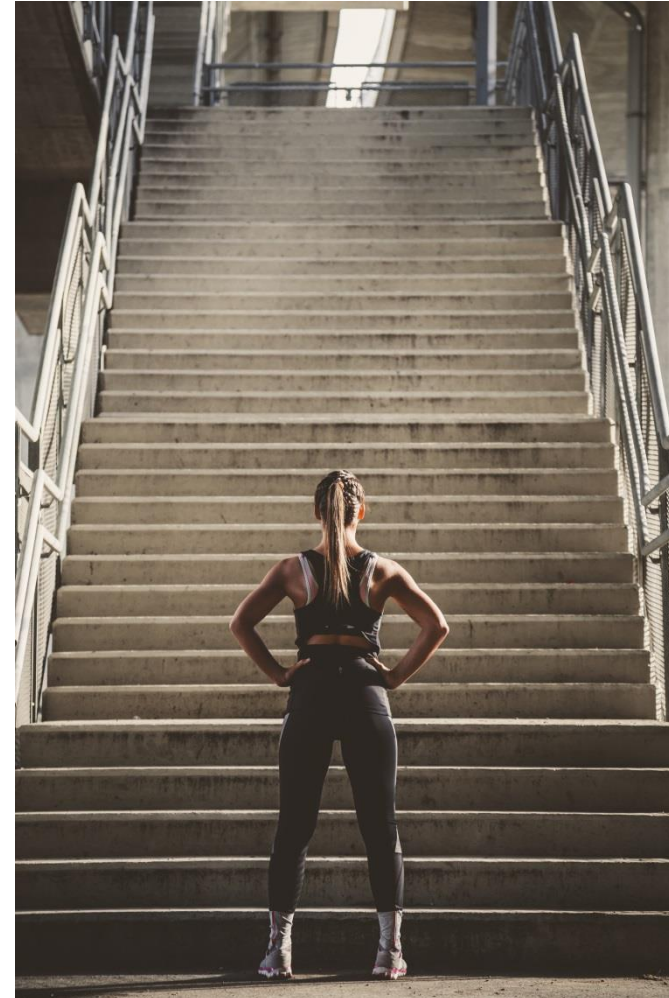
All of our hard work comes together when we have an opportunity to perform, whether that's in a sports competition, a theatrical performance or in an examination.
