As a Catholic Academy our first priority in considering new pupils is those who are Catholic, but everyone is welcome in our community.

Curriculum

At Thomas More Catholic Voluntary Academy, we offer a rich and balanced curriculum tailored to meet the interests and abilities of every pupil. By combining traditional academic subjects with the Arts, we provide a broad education that leads to both GCSE and BTEC qualifications, helping every child thrive in a happy, supportive environment.

A key part of our approach is the Character Curriculum, which includes Relationships and Sex Education, PSHE (Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education), and Careers Education. These areas are essential in developing life skills such as emotional intelligence, resilience, and informed decision-making about future careers. We aim to ensure that your child grows into a well-rounded, confident individual.

While academic subjects like maths, science, and

English develop critical thinking, the Arts nurture creativity and personal growth. These subjects build confidence and encourage self-expression, enriching your child's overall education.

Our two-week timetable, consisting of 25 one-hour lessons per week, allows pupils to explore a wide range of subjects in depth, ensuring a varied and engaging learning experience. For those needing extra support, we offer targeted intervention programmes, ranging from short-term assistance to year-long support, helping every child succeed.

At Thomas More, we focus on more than just academic success—we prepare pupils for life. By blending academic achievement with personal development, we help your child take on the future with confidence.

Key Stage 3

Years 7, 8 and 9 are termed 'Key Stage 3'. St Thomas More pupils study a wide range of subjects within KS3, including Religious Education, Maths, English, Science, Music, Art, Physical Education, Geography, History, Computer Science, Spanish, Food Technology, Design Technology and Drama.

In Key Stage 3 pupils are taught in both mixed and grouped ability with additional support provided for those who are identified as having special educational needs.

Key Stage 4

Years 10 and 11 are termed 'Key Stage 4'. The Academy provides a broad spectrum of subjects reflecting the wide range of personal interests, aspirations and needs of our students. However, all pupils study a common core of Religious Education, English, Maths and Combined or Triple Science, as well as participating in two hours of core PE.

In Year 9, pupils choose their GCSE/BTEC options for KS4, selecting 3 subjects to complement their core curriculum. Our wide range of courses includes GCSEs in Geography, History, Spanish, Computer Science, Art & Design, Drama, Music, Food Preparation and Nutrition and Design Technology. STM also offers a vocational BTEC course in Sport.

Teaching and Learning

We're committed to creating a safe, caring, and supportive environment where pupils can thrive and reach their full potential. We want our pupils to take charge of their own learning, develop a positive 'growth' mindset, and understand that setbacks and disappointments are part of becoming a stronger learner.

Great teaching and learning are at the heart of what we do. Our dedicated team of teachers and support staff work closely together to provide exciting and high-quality learning experiences for every pupil. We're also passionate about making sure our staff are continually growing too. That's why we offer lots of ongoing training and professional development (CPD) to our staff, helping

them stay up-to-date with the latest teaching methods. This means our teachers can adapt and tailor their approaches to meet the unique needs of every child, ensuring they get the support they need to thrive.

We believe in putting children at the centre of their learning journey. We focus on developing important life skills like resourcefulness, resilience, and co-operation, which will help them not just in school, but in life.

Caring for our Pupils

At St Thomas More, we believe our school is a truly special place. We pride ourselves on knowing and caring for each of our pupils as individuals. Affectionately known as “Tommies”, our close-knit, family feel is what draws many families to our community.

As a small school, we build strong relationships with each pupil, recognising their unique strengths and helping them grow in areas where they need support. Our dedicated pastoral team works tirelessly every day to support all pupils. This team includes members of the Senior Leadership Team, Pastoral Managers, Heads of Learning, our Pupil and Family Support Worker, Inclusion Manager, Lay Chaplain, and Form Tutors.

Your child’s Form Tutor will be your main point of contact and can assist with most questions or concerns you may have. For more significant issues, our Pastoral Managers and Heads of Learning are available to offer extra support, whether it relates to academic progress or personal matters. You can reach out to them through various means, including phone, email, letter, or by writing a note in your child’s planner.

Please do keep us informed of any important changes, such as illness, absence, or changes at home, so we can ensure your child receives the appropriate care and support they need.

We are incredibly proud of the strong, positive relationships our staff have with pupils. Our behaviour system, centred around our ASPIRE values, encourages responsibility and mutual respect within our community. 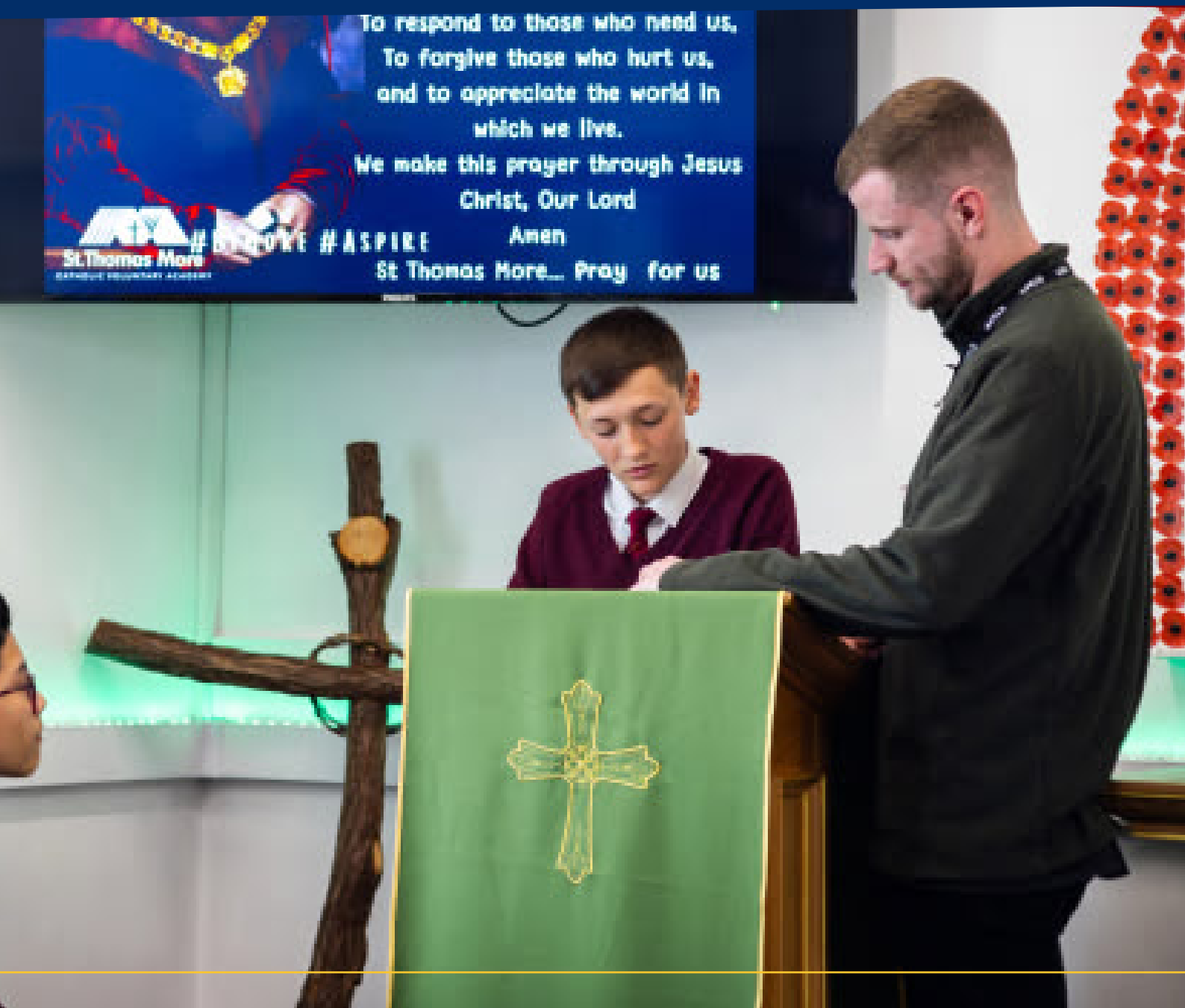

Learning Needs

We are a strong caring team who pride ourselves on ensuring pupils are well supported, happy and achieve their potential. The aim of the department is to ensure the inclusion of all children irrespective of need, into a mainstream educational setting. It also enables all young people to access the curriculum to achieve their very best.

The department offers:

- Specialist Teaching Assistants.
- Standardised ability and attainment assessments to establish literacy and numeracy skills and to inform provision.
- Small group interventions.
- Emotional Literacy Support (ELSA).
- Accelerated Reading Scheme including sessions with readers.

- SEN Pupil Passport.
- In-house assessments by the SENCO to establish any learning needs, planning a course of intervention as necessary.
- Additional induction sessions, over and above those organised by the Transition Coordinator.
- A caring, nurturing environment at break and lunch time.
- Homework club.

We work closely with outside agencies such as Educational Psychologists, CAMHS, Youth Team, Speech and Language therapists, family resource workers etc. to ensure we have relevant expertise available to assist all our students.
